Abstract: In November 1982, a tugboat struck and severed the William B. Umstead Bridge which links the community of Manns Harbor with Roanoke Island, and by extension, the rest of the Outer Banks. Students in the small mainland community were not able to reach their schools in Manteo for several weeks. During that time, the local community center was utilized as a school.

Historical Note

On November 5, 1985 a tugboat towing a barge struck the William B. Umstead Bridge and severed travel connections between the mainland community of Manns Harbor and Roanoke Island and by extension, the rest of the Outer Banks. In order to provide for uninterrupted education, the people of Manns Harbor joined together to create a temporary school for the students so they could continue their education while the bridge was being repaired. High school students rode a ferry back and forth to school each day, but 80 kindergarten through sixth grade students attended classes in the Manns Harbor Community School for approximately one month.
