The North Carolina Historical Commission recognized at the beginning of the war the importance of collecting materials bearing upon the part played by North Carolina soldiers and civilians in the struggle. Therefore, in cooperation with the North Carolina Council of Defense, a special history committee was appointed to collect the war records of the state. The committee sought and received the cooperation of such organizations as the state and county Councils of Defense; the state and county Fuel Administrations; the state and county Food Administrations; the American Red Cross; and other organizations engaged in war work. The committee urged these groups to preserve their records and ultimately deposit them with the Historical Commission. Additional assistance was secured for this work through the appointment in each county of a county historian for war purposes. As a result, the contains some material from 85 of the state's 100 counties. Finally, the private papers of several former officers and soldiers were obtained and now form an important part of the collection.

Records collected by county historians or others appointed specifically for the purpose of saving contemporary documents to capture information concerning the military service of soldiers from each county and the activities of various local organizations during the war. Robert B. House, collector of war records for the North Carolina Historical Society, acted as statewide clearinghouse for the project. Individuals in a handful of counties were avidly engaged in the solicitation and preservation of local war records, but many counties contributed nothing at all. Among the more active wartime records collectors were Frank Wood (Chowan County), Mrs. John Huske Anderson (Cumberland), Daisy Crump Whitehead (Halifax), Mrs. L. D. Swindell (Hyde), James Sprunt (New Hanover), W. Brodie Jones (Warren), and James Dempsey Bullock (Wilson). In many instances, the only historical record for a county in this series is a listing of the local organization of the Food Administration, probably added to the files by House or another staff member of the Historical Commission. The commission apparently also conducted a news-clipping service during the war; their contributions to this series may be recognized by typed labels identifying the source and the date of the clipping. In several counties, the local collector also contributed newspaper clippings.

The files of four counties – Buncombe, Cumberland, Halifax, and Warren – include wartime letters from soldiers. Soldiers' questionnaires detailing their military service were returned by Halifax, Surry, and Warren counties. Cumberland, Halifax, and Wilson contributed significant collections of soldiers' photographs. Several other counties, including Buncombe, Haywood, Hyde, Madison, Stanly, Wake, and Wayne, sent in photographs of local civic leaders, industries, or military scenes. Other types of

records in this series include sketches of wartime activities of various county organizations, lists of soldiers, and published materials. Guilford County prepared cards detailing the individual service records of its soldiers; these are arranged alphabetically in Box 5. In Halifax County, a contest was staged in 1920, in which schoolchildren were challenged to write a biographical sketch of an ex-servicemen. The records from Warren County include three boxes of woodcuts bearing portraits of soldiers that appeared in *The Warren Record*. Wilson County contributed three oversized scrapbooks, which contain numerous photographs of soldiers, nurses, and civic leaders.
