1. 1706, Mar. 31. Perquimans, North Carolina.
From the Quarterly Meeting to the London Meeting. Reports on the status of the Meeting and notes building of two meeting houses and progress on third. Opposition to their efforts due to Quarter disapproval of adulterous relationship of Deputy Governor who left his wife in South Carolina, which led to removal of Quakers from the Council. Controversy led to replacement of the Deputy Governor by Governor Johnson, but the new one is no better. Asks if the London Meeting will appeal to the Lords Proprietors the Queen for restoration of former privileges. Nine signatures. 81.182.1-3
2. 1707, 4, 5 and 6 Oct. From the Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to the Yearly Meeting in London. Reports on the organization of meetings in North Carolina and mentions that Friends of the Perquimans Meeting had goods taken for support of priests of the Church of England and the same is expected in Pasquotane (sic). Signed by Gabriel Newby.. 81.183.1-2
3. 1716, 6 and 7 Oct. From Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to Yearly Meeting in London. Reports on meetings and asks for epistles from London which greatly comfort North Carolina Friends. Signed by Joseph Glaister and Wm. Haige. 81.184.1-2
4. 1718, 4 and 5 Oct. From Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to Yearly Meeting in London. Reports that the Yearly Meeting is the largest ever held in North Carolina. Relations with the Government are good. Signed by Joseph Glaister and Wm. Haig. 81.185.1-2
5. 1719, 3 and 4 July. Same to Same. Have received several epistles from London in 1718 and report no evidence of pride and vanity in dress among Friends in North Carolina, as mentioned in an epistle. Six signatures. 81.186.1-2
6. 1722, 5 and 6 Oct. Same to Same. Usual report on condition of Friends in North Carolina, but mentions tithes being taken for the Established Church by violence. Signed by Gabriel Newby. 81.187.1-2

7. 1724, 8 and 9 Oct. From the Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to the Yearly Meeting in London. Reports on Meetings and says the situation regarding parish rates has currently eased, due to the clemency of the present Governor. Mentions a great mortality in the country. Signed by Gabriel Newby. 81.188.1-2
8. 1727, 7 and 8 Oct. Paquinance (sic) North Carolina Yearly Meeting to the Yearly Meeting in London. Usual report and states that Friends in North Carolina are not bothered by tithes, priests wages for the Anglican Church, etc. at the current time. Seven signatures. 81.189.1
9. 1729, 4 and 5 Oct. Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to the Yearly Meeting in London. Held the largest meeting ever and mentions that they have received no epistles from England for several years. Eight signatures. 81.190.1-2
10. 1730, 3 and 4 Oct. Same to Same. Usual report on condition of Friends in North Carolina. Have received epistle from England and report no trials at present. Five signatures. 81.191.1
11. 1731, 2 and 3 Oct. Same to Same. Reports on situation of Friends and says that due to change of Government, parish rates are not demanded of Quakers and military affairs have eased. Four signatures. 81.192.1-2
12. 1734, 4 and 6 Sept. Yearly Meeting at Pequimans (sic) North Carolina to the Yearly Meeting in London. No unusual items reported and only regular greetings sent. Signed by Benj. Pritchard, clerk. 81.193.1-2
13. 1735, 3, 4 and 5 Oct. Paquinance (sic) Yearly Meeting in North Carolina to the London Yearly Meeting. Recent attempts to gather tithes for Established Church have failed. Signed by Gabriel Newby. 81.194.1-2

1. 1737, 30 *Sept.* - 2 *Oct.* Paquimance (*sic*) North Carolina, Yearly Meeting of North Carolina to the Yearly Meeting in London. Letter of brotherly love, little information on situation in North Carolina. 16 signatures. 81.195.1-2
2. 1738, 6 - 9 *Sept.* Paquimance (*sic*) Same to Same. Received an Epistle in 1737 and report little trouble over tithes, etc. although a Reader takes a small amount for the Church of England. 15 signatures. 81.195.2-3
3. 1739, 5-7 *Oct.* Same to same. Letter of brotherly love with no unusual information regarding North Carolina. 17 signatures. 81.196.1-2
4. 1740, 3, 4 and 5 *Oct.* Same to same. Reports on meeting and says several elders have died in the past year. Asks that epistles be directed to Zachariah Nixon in Perquimans County, N.C., to John Pleasants in James River, Va., or Thomas Trotter of Nancimund, who will forward them to Nixon. 20 signatures. 81.197.1-2
5. 1742, 1-3 *Oct.* Same to same. Report numbers of conversions and no sufferings except on small accounts because of the Militia Act. 16 signatures. 81.198.1-2
6. 1743, 30 *Sept.* - 2 *Oct.* Same to same. Reports receiving epistles; no great sufferings, but £5 fines for not mustering with the militia. Gives news of a meeting in the south and conversions near Cape Fear. 30 signatures. encl. 81.199.1
7. N.D. (but evidently same as above) Asks for advice in paying taxes recently passed by Assembly for maintaining a magazine of arms in each county. 13 signatures. 81.200.1
8. 1746, 3-5 *Oct.* Same to same. Usual report; no sufferings for either militia or Anglican Church taxes. Reports on community of Friends in Cape Fear. 28 signatures. 81.201.1-3

9. 1747, 2-4 *Oct.* Perquimans. North Carolina Yearly Meeting to the London Yearly Meeting. Report on epistles received and note that members from Cape Fear attended the annual meeting. No sufferings reported. 38 signatures. 81.202.1-2
10. 1748, 30 *Sept*-2 *Oct.* Old Neck, Perquimans. Same to same. Usual report with no sufferings nor outstanding events to report. 22 signatures. 81.203.1-2
11. 1749, 6-8 *Oct.* Perquimans. Same to same. Discussion on methods of sending epistles, due to recent loss of several. No unusual information. 21 signatures. 81.204.1-2
12. 1751, 4-6 *Oct.* Old Neck, Perquimans. Same to same. Usual letter with no sufferings reported. 28 signatures. 81.205.1-2
13. 1750, 7 *Oct.* Perquimans, Same to same. Usual report of meetings with some mention of Friends in the Cape Fear area. 18 Signatures. 81.206.1-2
14. 1752, 13-15 *Oct.* Old Neck, Perquimans. Same to same. Usual report; no trials or sufferings from authorities; mentions high mortality rate during past year. 27 signatures. 81.206.2-4
15. 1753, 12-14 *Oct.* Perquimans. Same to same. Usual report; no mention of sufferings. 29 signatures. 81.207.1-2
16. 1754, 11-13 *Oct.* Same. Same to same. Usual report; still relieved by the clemency of the government from paying tithes or military taxes. 25 signatures. 81.208.1-2
17. 1755, 10-12 *Oct.* Old Neck, Perquimans. Same to same. Usual report, but mentions that Meeting not as well attended as should be. 22 signatures. 81.209.1-2
18. 1756, 8-10 *Oct.* Same. Same to same. Usual report, but mentions addition of members in the western part of North Carolina. Says sufferings exist on account of wages for priests of the Established Church, but they also expect further sufferings due to rumours of war and their refusal to bear arms. 31 signatures. 81.210.1-3

2. 1758, 13-15 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting to Yearly Meeting, London. Have received epistles. Problems with "Priests Hire" and Militia Act have cost them £12 though latter mitigated by the "Tenderness of several of the Officers." 32 signatures. 81.212.1-2
3. 1759, 26-28 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting to Yearly Meeting, London. Attendance at weekly and quarterly meetings not as good as it should be. Quarterly Meeting established in the western part of the province. Their epistles received. Fines for "Priests Wages" and Militia Act over £85. 28 signatures. 81.213.1-2
4. 1760, 24-26 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Have received their epistles. Fines under Vestry Act were c. £25. 81.214.1-2
5. (1761?) 23-26 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting to Yearly Meeting, London. Have received their Epistles. Attendance at weekday meetings has improved, no "sufferings" this year. 29 signatures. 81.215.1-2
6. 1762, 22-24 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting to Yearly Meeting, London. Have received their Epistles. Attendance has improved. Militia fines this year were £14. 39 signatures. 81.216.1-2

10. (1766) 24-26 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Their Epistles received. Quarterly Meetings are "tolerable well attended," no accounts of sufferings. 27 signatures. 81.220.1-2
11. 1767, 23-25 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Some "Remissness" in some Quarterly Meetings. Received Epistles. Have had visits from Ministers and Elders from "distant Parts." 32 signatures. 81.221.1-2
12. 1768, 28-30 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North Carolina, Yearly Meeting to Yearly Meeting, London. Received Epistles. Attendance fairly good. Sufferings under Vestry Act £5. 34 signatures. 81.222.1-2

Quarterly Meetings generally good, but expresses "a real concern and hearty sorrow for the lukewarmness and indifference that too plainly appears in too many." Epistles received as well as "Richard Davies Journals and Ambrose Rigge's Warnings." Sufferings 21 10s. Steps taken to stop spread of slaveholding among Friends. 59 signatures. 81.228.1-3
19. 1773, 22-24 October. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North and South Carolina, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Their Epistles received, hope slavery will end soon, no sufferings. 54 signatures. 81.229.1-2

2. 1777, 24-27 October, Thomas White, Clerk. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North and South Carolina and Georgia, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Epistles received. Several Friends have freed their slaves, but some have been seized and sold. 81.233.1-2
3. 1779, 22-25 October. George Walton, Clerk to the Meeting. Old Neck, Perquimans County, North and South Carolina and Georgia, Yearly Meeting, to Yearly Meeting, London. Epistles received, sufferings due to Militia Laws and taxes is £2,152. 81.234.1-2
4. 1780, 27-30 October. George Walton, Clerk to Annual Meetings of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Old Neck, Perquimans County, to Yearly Meeting, London. Have not heard from them. Sufferings by Military Requisitions is £841. 81.235.1-2

6. 1782, 25-27 October. Benjamin Albertson, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Old Neck, Perquimans County, to Yearly Meeting, London. Their Epistles received, "considerable" number of slaves freed, sufferings appear small but this is due to lack of reports. 81.237.1-2
7. 1783, 24-27 October. Benjamin Albertson, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Old Neck, Perquimans County, to Yearly Meeting, London. Some friends still hold slaves, though several have been freed. Epistles received. Sufferings for military requisitions is £718. 81.238.1-2

8. 1784, 22-25, October. Benjamin Albertson, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Old Neck, Perquimans County, to Yearly Meeting, London. Have not received their Epistles. Despite their efforts, slavery still exists though some have been freed. 81.239.1
9. 1785, 28-31 October. Benjamin Albertson, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Old Neck, Perquimans County, to Yearly Meeting, London. Their Epistles received. John Townsend has arrived. Anti-slavery efforts have had some effect. 81.240.1-2
10. 1786, (?) - 30 October. Benjamin Albertson, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, near head of Little River. No Epistle received. 12. 1788, 27-30 October. Levi Mundin, Clerk to Annual Meeting of North and South Carolina and Georgia, Wells, Perquimans County, to Annual Meeting, London. General affairs, some slaves freed, then seized and resold. 81.243.1-2

4. 1719, 4 *Jan*. London. Same to Friends at the Yearly meeting in North Carolina. In response to letters from North Carolina general meetings of 1718 and 1719. Have entered Wm. Arnistead and Jno. Bell as correspondents in the Yearly Meeting book. 81.255.1-2
5. 1730, ¹⁷²⁸8 *Jan*. London. Same to Friends in North Carolina. Haved received epistles for 1728 and 1729 and regret that none of London's to North Carolina for many years have arrived. Usual admonitions and sympathy for sufferings. 81.256.1-2
6. 1731, ¹⁷²⁸28 *Jan*. London. Same to Yearly Meeting in North Carolina. Short letter of brotherly love and reference to printed epistle. 81.257.1

1. 1738, 25 *Aug.* London. Yearly Meeting to the Yearly Meeting in North Carolina. Have received no epistles from North Carolina for two years. Usual advice and expressions of brotherly love. 81.261.1-2
2. 1739, 27 *July.* Same. Same to same. Usual letter, but a postscript notes that two previous correspondents were not included in the North Carolina epistles of 1737 and 1738 and London desires two more to be named. They urge North Carolina Friends to keep contacts with London. 81.262.1-2
3. 1740, 15 *Aug.* Same. Same to same. Read epistles of 1737 and 1738 which arrived too late to be read at the previous Yearly Meeting. 81.263.1-2
4. 1741, 26 *June.* Same. Same to same. Epistle of 1739 read in the recent Yearly Meeting. Evidently those epistles from London for 1738 and 1739 have miscarried. London will send copies of them. 81.264.1-2
5. 1742, 22 *Oct.* Same. Same to same. Usual letter. Asks North Carolina friends to note if the last epistles from London reached them. 81.265.1-2
6. 1743, 1 *July.* Same. Same to same. Similar epistles to all others but urges Friends to be careful in the education of youth. 81.266.1-2
7. 1744, 1 *June.* Same. Same to same. Response to epistle of 1743. Urges brotherly love and aid to Friends in Cape Fear valley. 81.267.1-2
8. 1744, 29 *June.* Same. Same to Friends on the North West Branch of Cape Fear in Bladen County, North Carolina. A letter from Eliz. Shipley and Esther White has acquainted London with the Cape Fear Friends. The London Meeting is sending them some books and urges them to maintain the faith and hold regular meetings. Notes that London has written to other Friends in North Carolina regarding the Cape Fear group. 81.267.1-3

9. 1746, 15 *Aug.* London. Yearly Meeting to the Yearly Meeting in North Carolina. Urge continued help to the Cape Fear Friends. Give advice on tax for militia and ask for a copy of militia act of the Assembly in order to give better advice. 81.268.1-3
10. 1747, 16 *Oct.* Same. Same to same. Epistles of 1744 and 1745 never arrived. That of 1746 arrived too late to be read at the last Yearly Meeting. Usual advice and expressions. 81.269.1-3
11. 1749, 28 *July.* Same, same to same. Expresses concern for Friends in the Cape Fear area. Have not heard from North Carolina recently and urge them to continue to write. 81.270.1-2
12. 1750, 27 *July.* Same. Same to same. Have received epistle of 1748 and mention that Thomas Nicholson of North Carolina was at the past London Yearly Meeting. Usual advice. 81.271.1-2
13. 1751, 5 *July.* Same. Same to same. Usual letter and asks again about community in Cape Fear valley. Have received epistle of 1749. 81.272.1-2
14. 1752, 14 *Oct.* Same. Same to same. Mentions information received that some Friends have moved from Pennsylvania to the "back parts" of North Carolina and urge care and help for them. 81.273.1-2
