MONSON FAMILY PAPERS. Miscellaneous accounts.

1. 1741, June 15. Kingston, Jamaica. Wm. Blakeney to Henry Pelham. (Paymaster General) Discussion of means of payment of troops in the West Indies after the Cartagena expedition. Mentions the payment of £2184, 4s, 11d for three companies from North Carolina.

MONSON FAMILY PAPERS. Papers relating to trade and
the plantations.

1. N.D. (1739?) "Petition of Henry McCulloh for Regulating the land office in South and North Carolina." Gives plans for proposed regulations of quit rents and trade in order to increase revenues. X 81.95.1-7
2. 1739, May 16. St. James. Extract of a commission to Henry McCulloh to enquire into frauds of land grants and quit rents in North and South Carolina. 81.96.1-4
3. N.D. (1736?) "State of the Blank Patents and of the Use intended to be made of them." An unsigned description of abuses in land grants by Governor Everard in 1729-30. 81.97.1-4
4. N.D. "Objections against the Quit Rent Laws." More discussion of the abuses by Everard et al. in the quit rent frauds in North Carolina. 81.98.1-4
5. N.D. "A Short State of the Paper Bills of Currency used in Several Provinces on the Continent of America." Includes a discussion of issuance of paper currency in North Carolina. X 81.99.1-10

Correspondence 1739-1743.

1. 1740, 24 July. New York. William Blakeney to Henry Pelham. Methods of payment for troops raised in America. Bills are remitted to several governors of North American provinces in part for three months' subsistence for troops from their colonies. Includes remittance to Gabriel Johnston for four North Carolina companies.

2. 1740, 23 October. Hampton, Virginia. William Blakeney to Henry Pelham. Notes that all the forces from America have received their subsistence, except those from North Carolina to whom Blakeney is sending bills from Virginia. Complains of Colonel Gooch sailing for America before detachments from all provinces had met in Hampton. The four North Carolina companies were left behind and refused to embark without three pistoles advance promised them. Blakeney has written to Governor Johnston about this and asked to see that companies are embarked from North Carolina for Jamaica as soon as possible. Has sent him bills for £1016 for balance of North Carolina troops subsistence.
