 Condemned at Halifax as taken by the Niger, George Talbot, commander.
- 2. [1780 Aug 4. Court of St. James's. Warrant to John Randall, judge of Vice Admiralty Court in Bermuda, to pay to owners, etc., of the Tryon and the George & Elizabeth the proceeds from the prize the Charming Peggy, captured 9 Oct 1778, burthen 40 tons, cargo of flour, ship bread, Indian corn, soap, wax, tobacco, bacon, candles, tar, and inch pine boards. Condemned at Bermuda.
- 3. [1780 Aug 4. Same to pay owners, etc., of the Tryon the proceeds of the prize Lovely Betsy, seized the 5th of Oct 1778, 40 tons, cargo of Indian corn, flour, and tobacco. Condemned at Bermuda, was captured by Tryon and the George & Elizabeth.
- 4. 1783 Jul 25. Richard Burke to Charles Stewart, directing him to pay the back salaries of certain customs officers, including William Palmer, Collector at Bath, N.C.
