## Introduction

#### Scope of the Guide

This guide is focused on records of the General Assembly of North Carolina from 1777 to 1789 that contain the voices of enslaved and free people of color, religious minorities, women, and American Indians. The State Archives of North Carolina preserves original General Assembly records, and provides digital copies to the public through the North Carolina Digital Collections on the State Archives of North Carolina website. Though this guide may not include every record pertaining to women, enslaved and free people of color, American Indians, and religious minorities, it is intended to serve as a tool supporting further research about these groups of people in North Carolina's early history.

#### Content Warning

Archival records reflect the language and attitudes of the historical period in which they were created. The General Assembly Session Records from this period include content and language that may be harmful or upsetting to researchers. These records include actions that can be offensive, discriminatory, and depict acts of terrorism or violence.

#### Contextual Note

The records cited in this guide span from 1777 to 1789. Though this guide uses the terminology suggested by historians and archivists, the records it describes generally do not. Researchers should be prepared to encounter upsetting and offensive terminology describing enslaved persons, free persons of color, and American Indians.

#### A Brief History of the General Assembly in Early Statehood

North Carolina's first State Constitution, adopted in 1776, gave the General Assembly control over all areas of government to prevent conflicts between that body and the executive branch. It could even elect all executive and judicial officials, including the governor. Over time, the General Assembly's power diminished, leading to the current balance of powers between the three branches.

The 1776 State Constitution retained a pre-existing bicameral structure, though the houses that made up the General Assembly changed. The names of the new houses were the Senate and the House of Commons rather than the Upper House and the House of Burgesses. Today, the House of Commons is known as the House of Representatives. Each county received one representative in the Senate and two representatives in the House of Commons. Particularly large districts, such as Hillsborough or New Bern, also had their own representative in the House of Commons.

Until 1835, free men, regardless of race, could vote in General Assembly elections, though the voting requirements differed between the two bodies.

#### Legal Definitions

Source of definitions: General Assembly Glossary (Help - Glossary - North Carolina General Assembly)

- Act: Legislation enacted into law. A bill that has passed both houses of the legislature, been enrolled, ratified, signed by the governor or passed over the governor's office, and printed. It is a permanent measure, having the force of law until repealed.
- Adoption: Approval or acceptance; usually applied to amendments, committee reports, or resolutions.
- Amendment: Any alteration made (or proposed to be made) to a bill or clause thereof, by adding, deleting, substituting, or omitting.
- Apportionment: Establishment of the legislative districts from which members are elected.
- **Bill:** Draft of a proposed law presented to the legislature for consideration.
- **Code:** A compilation of laws and their revisions according to subject matter arranged by title, chapter, and section. The official code of North Carolina is the North Carolina General Statutes.
- **Committee:** A body of members appointed by the presiding officer (or another authority specified by the chamber) to consider and make recommendations concerning disposition of bills, resolutions, and other related matters.
- **Committee Report:** Official release of a bill or resolution from committee with (or without) a specific recommendation, such as "pass", "pass as amended", or "do not pass".
- **Concurrence (To Concur):** Action by which one house agrees to a proposal or action that the other chamber has approved.
- **Constituent:** A citizen residing within the district of a legislator.
- **District:** That division of the state represented by a legislator distinguished numerically or by geographical boundaries
- Hearing: Public discussion and appearance on a proposal or bill; usually scheduled by a committee.
- **Joint Committee:** A committee composed of members from both chambers.
- Joint Session: A combined meeting of the Senate and House in one chamber.
- Measure: General term for bill, resolution, or memorial.
- **Non-Standing Committee or Commission:** A committee or commission authorized by legislation to study specific topics. The powers and duties of each committee are set forth in the authorizing legislation.
- **Petition:** Formal request submitted by an individual or group of individuals to the legislature.
- Referral: The assigning or referring of a bill to committee
- Regular Session: The annual (or biennial) meeting of the legislature required by constitution.
- **Resolution:** A document that expresses the sentiment or intent of the legislature or a chamber, that governs the business of the legislature, or a chamber, or that expresses recognition by the legislature or a chamber
- Session: (1) Period during which the legislature meets; (2) the daily meeting of the Senate or House.
- **Special Session:** A special meeting of the legislature that is called by the governor (or the legislature itself) and limited to specific matters. Also called a Extraordinary Session.
- **Standing Committee:** A committee appointed with continuing responsibility in a general issue area or field of legislative activity.
- **Statute:** A formal enactment of the legislature of a more permanent nature. The term "statute" is used to designate written law, as distinguished from unwritten law.
- Supplemental Appropriation: Adjustment of funds allocated by the original appropriation.
- **Title:** A concise statement of the subject and the contents of a bill.



#### Additional notes:

Today, a **memorial** is "the method by which the legislature addresses or petitions Congress and other governments or governmental agencies." However, historically, a memorial was a written statement of facts that accompanied a petition.

Today, a **select committee** is "a committee established by the Speaker of the House, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or by an adopted resolution of either Chamber for a particular issue. This committee may be established as a single chamber committee or as a joint committee. The powers and duties for the committee are set forth by the establishing authority and the membership is appointed by the Speaker of the House and/or the President Pro tempore of the Senate." However, until 1868, the highest-ranking official in the Senate was known as the Speaker of the Senate.

#### How Were Petitions Submitted?

To submit a petition, the petitioner first had to write the document. They could do this by themselves or with the help of a friend, relative, or clerk. This is why many petitions have multiple names on them, even if the request only has to do with one person. Both during and after the American Revolution, it became increasingly common for men to submit group petitions, which were generally intended to indicate widespread support for a desired policy change. Women were more likely to submit individual petitions, usually seeking to solve the problem of an individual.

After the petitioner(s) wrote their petition, they presented it to their county court. If the justices of the county court certified the petition, it was then forwarded to the county's legislative representative, who would present it to the General Assembly. After a petition was first read to the General Assembly, it would be remanded to a committee that would be responsible for considering it further. This committee would later report back to the General Assembly, and the General Assembly would either grant or reject the petition based on the committee's recommendations.



## How to Read the Guide

The documents from the General Assembly Session Records are described in tables. The records are broken into four larger categories:

- Women
- Enslaved and Free People of Color
- American Indians
- Religious Minority Groups

Each section has several subsets of topics of records. A document may have relevance to more than one topic. For example, in the "Women" section, the same petition may have the assigned topics of "Widows" and "Financial Requests." Documents that fit into the larger theme but that do not fit into any specific topic are listed as "General."

Documents do not repeat within a section but can appear in multiple larger sections if relevant to more than one general theme.

Each document appears in a row like the one below:

- "Folder" and "Specific Item" columns refer to the physical arrangement of the General Assembly Session
  Records. Occasionally, multiple items in the same folder are included in the table. Where only one record
  appears in a folder, the "Specific Item" column will list "Entire folder."
- The "Date" column lists the date provided on the document itself. The proposed bill or petition may have created further actions at later dates.
- The **local call number** is how a researcher can locate the document in the State Archives. The top line (i.e. GASR Apr-May 1778, Box 1) is the number of the **box** that researchers could request to examine in person. The bottom line (e.g. 66.8.12.12) is the unique identifier assigned to the **folder**. Researchers can enter this identifier into the search bar on the Digital Collections page (digital.dncr.nc.gov) to navigate to scans of that folder, in which they will find the highlighted record.
- The Topic column provides subjects to facilitate research.



# **Women in General Assembly Records**

The General Assembly Session Records discussed in this section consist of a mix of bills, reports, resolutions, and more. Some of the most compelling documents take the form of petitions by and about women. According to English legal tradition, from which the practice of petitioning originally stemmed, all inhabitants, including women, had the right to petition the legislature. Submitting petitions was a way for women to participate politically. Most petitions and other records discussed in this section of the guide were written by and about white women. However, enslaved and free women of color are not absent from the records. The records for this section are assigned to the following topics:

#### Financial Requests

As the General Assembly Session Records are legal documents, the petitions and related documents authored by or concerning women are often financial in nature. Many are authored by widows, as widows were the only women able to own property and represent themselves legally. A large percentage of those petitions were financial requests. The four main types of petition requests were to receive payment owed to their deceased husbands for military service, to ask for compensation for goods or services provided during the Revolutionary War, to seek the return of confiscated property previously owned by Loyalists, and to plead for economic relief in the form of money or goods.

#### **Widows**

A large percentage of the petitions submitted to the General Assembly from women came from widows who sought compensation for their deceased husbands' service or for other services rendered during the Revolutionary War. Widows also sought economic relief during times of hardship. Widows had different and stronger legal standing than married or unmarried women, so records specifically relating to widows are lumped into their own category that is a subset of the financial requests category.

#### Family Roles

Both white children and children of color appear in the General Assembly records. They have been included in this section of the guide and categorized under Family Roles. Many women mention their children in their petitions or are discussed in the records alongside their children. When petitioning the General Assembly, some mothers cited their small, helpless children to arouse sympathy from the members of the General Assembly and to increase the likelihood of their petitions being granted.

Another aspect of family roles that sometimes appears in the early General Assembly Session Records is marriage (and divorce). One important factor to note is that only the General Assembly could grant a divorce until 1808, so couples wishing to dissolve their marriage had to petition the General Assembly.

#### Women at Work

It was generally not considered appropriate for women to be involved in politics, but they inevitably participated when they petitioned the General Assembly. Hints of women being involved in the public sphere also can be found in records when women leverage their political connections while petitioning or are described to have earned a certain degree of fame (or notoriety).

#### Women and Children of Color

Enslaved and free children of color often appear in documents defining the age of adulthood. Enslaved children also appear in documents assigning monetary value to them as property. Note that children were assigned an enslaved or free status based on the status of their mothers.



The distinction between enslaved and free people of color, including enslaved and free women of color, can sometimes be unclear in records. Several documents specify the emancipation of enslaved women of color.

# **Enslaved and Free People of Color in General Assembly Records**

Enslaved persons could not directly participate in petitioning the General Assembly. They appear in the records listed here as the subjects of petitions submitted by other individuals, whether they were enslavers or those requesting emancipation and manumission. This guide also includes changes to the laws governing slavery. Iin contrast, free people of color retained the ability to petition the General Assembly. Their petitions cover a variety of matters, including financial settlements, legal disputes, and redress of grievances. The records for this section are assigned into the following topics:

#### Enslaved Persons Described in Terms of Property (Property Language)

The legal language of the late 18<sup>th</sup> century referred to enslaved persons in terms of property. This category marks those records where such language is prominent.

#### Laws Concerning Enslavement

In 1715, North Carolina enacted its first slave code. Over time, North Carolina's slave codes increased in complexity. The laws included in this category delineate changes to the slave code and other legal standards governing the practice of slavery of North Carolina.

#### **Enslaved Labor**

These records primarily focus on the practice of "hiring out," by which enslavers would provide enslaved persons to a third party and receive payment back for their labor. Petitions dealing with appropriate compensation for hiring out or resolving disputes between two enslavers are common. Some records also address specific jobs undertaken by enslaved persons.

#### Resistance to Slavery

Some records reflect forms of resistance such as violence against enslavers (including murder), theft, flight, and truancy . Laws dictated punishments including executions.

#### **Emancipation and Manumission**

The records in this category include laws modifying the terms of emancipation and manumission as well as specific petitions that sought manumission for individuals. A 1741 statute strengthened a clause in the 1715 slave code that limited manumission to enslaved persons who had performed "honest and Faithful service" by adding that enslaved persons could only be manumitted for meritorious services. County courts decided what counted as a meritorious service they issued licenses when they approved manumission.

#### Free People of Color

During the years 1777-1789, free people of color had the same legal standing as white residents. The records within this category are primarily petitions identifying the petitioner as a free person of color.

The definition of a "free person of color" was somewhat broad and used as a label to describe anyone who was free but not considered to be white. This could include free people of ancestry including African, American Indian, East Indian, and mixed ancestry.

# **American Indians in General Assembly Records**

The General Assembly Session Records between 1777 and 1789 include American Indians' interaction with the European-descended residents and government of the North Carolina. Those interactions were occasionally peaceful, as in treaties, but violence and disregard of established land boundaries appear often in these records.

The three nations named in these records are the Cherokee, the Tuscarora, and the Chickamauga. The nation is included in the below table when identified within the record. The records for this section are assigned into the following topics:

#### **Treaties**

This category includes treaties forged between the North Carolina government and the leaders of American Indian nations.

#### Land

This category includes discussions of the lands possessed by American Indian communities, including records related to governmental efforts to relocate them.

#### Conflict and Violence

Records in this category document instances of violence between American Indian communities and residents of European descent. Some of the records refer to official deployments of the North Carolina militia to wage war against members of American Indian nations while other records relate more to localized incidents.

# Religious Minority Groups in General Assembly Records

The most prominent community in these records are the Quakers (the Society of Friends). Their pacifism, aversion to oaths of allegiance, and efforts to manumit enslaved persons inspired several laws and petitions in these records. Other religious minority groups that appear include Moravians, German Baptists (also known as Dunkers or Dunkards), and Mennonites. The records for this section are assigned into the following topics:

#### Religious Exemptions

The records in this category include petitions seeking exemptions from military service or from swearing the Oath of Allegiance on religious grounds. Quakers and other communities could "affirm," rather than "swear," an Oath of Allegiance.

#### **Taxation**

The state did not force the Moravians, Quakers, Mennonites, and German Baptists to fight in the American Revolution. However, in return for their exemptions from militia service, the General Assembly imposed higher taxes upon members of these groups. At times, the tax was even three times greater than the standard tax imposed on other North Carolinians. The records in this category include both related laws and petitions seeking redress.

#### Opposition to Enslavement

The Quaker community in North Carolina actively opposed the slave trade and worked to manumit enslaved persons. The most common strategy Quakers used for emancipation was to purchase enslaved persons for the sole person of manumitting them. However, the General Assembly enacted statutes to make manumission more difficult. For example, the Quaker communities in Pasquotank County and Perquimans County fought a prolonged legal battle to prevent the re-sale of enslaved persons whom they had previously attempted to manumit. The records in this category document the efforts of Quakers and members of other faiths to oppose slavery and attempt acts of manumission.
