Collection consists of 16 black and white photographic prints ranging in size from 5"x7" to 6"x8" depicting a variety of North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, and unidentified places in the southern US, 1890-1920. Identified locations include the train depot in Morrisville, NC; downtown Spruce Pine, NC; Hancock Boarding House in Cheraw, SC; and Broad Street, Alta Vista, VA. Other scenes depict a rural landscape or park, a railroad trestle bridge, construction sites, factories, a group of businessmen, groups of factory or construction workers, an inn or hotel, a mining operation, and a man in a Panama Duck canvas tent.

PhC_207_02	Hancock Boarding House in Cheraw, SC, c.1905 Four men standing outside the Hancock Boarding House in Cheraw, SC, c.1905 (copied as (N.2003.7.6)
PhC_207_03	Broad Street looking north, Alta Vista, VA, c.1905 View of Broad Street looking north, Alta Vista, VA, c.1905. Hilly terrain visible in distance; a wagon pulled by a team of mules driven by a bearded man is coming up the street; Alta Vista Furniture Company is visible at left.
PhC_207_04	Unidentified inn along a railroad track, unknown location, c.189-1920 Exterior view of the front or train track entrance side of an unidentified inn, hotel, or lodge. Architecture appears to be Craftsman style, a man is standing on the long porch, and several rocking chairs are also on the porch.
PhC_207_05	Unidentified school or factory under construction, c.1900-1920 Exterior view of a two story brick building under construction. A construction worker, possibly African American, stands on the unfinished roofline of the structure.
PhC_207_06	Winter snow scene in a park, c.1890-1920 View of a winter snow scene in a park or rural area. Snow-covered pathways can be seen among icy trees. It could be Pullen Park in Raleigh, NC.
PhC_207_07	Snow scene outside a factory with three men and machines, c.1900-1920 View of a snow scene outside a brick factory of some sort with two open bays where three men are posing with a snow-covered steam engine.
PhC_207_08	Unidentified factory or mill, c.1900-1920 Exterior overall side view of a large factory (looks like a typical southern textile mill) with a group of men with mules clearing and grading a plot of land in the foreground.
PhC_207_09	Iron truss railroad bridge over a river, c.1900-1920 Overall view of an iron truss railroad bridge over a river with a man standing on it next to an electrical pole, a breakwater made of stones is visible in the foreground.
PhC_207_10	Unidentified group of workers, c.1900-1920 Overall view of a group of men, most wearing overalls and a few in suits (they look like construction workers and perhaps their supervisors) posing next to and in the windows of what appears to be either a factory or a similar brick building under construction.
PhC_207_11	Unidentified group of businessmen, c.1900-1920 Overall view of a group of five men in suits standing outside next to a wall of a frame house or building.

- PhC\_207\_12 Unidentified man and tent, c.1900-1920 Overall view of a man in a suit and derby hat outside a large canvas tent with the flaps open to reveal the words "Panama Duck" stenciled on the inner side of one of the flaps, two cots, a suitcase, and some other bundles are inside the tent, and a railroad track and electrical lines are visible in the background as is the hilly or mountainous terrain (this is clearly one tent among several - stakes and guywires from tents on either side are visible).
- PhC\_207\_13 Unidentified town, flat landscape, dirt road, c.1890-1920 A view looking down an unpaved street towards a business section of some small town – a shingle hung outside one of the houses on the right side of the road says "Dr. Mason" and the scene appears coastal.
- PhC\_207\_14 Unidentified mountain mining operation, c.1890-1920 A view looking up some railroad tracks at a mining operation in the mountains - two men, several train cars and a steam locomotive are in the shot at ground level and another track that conveyed whatever it was being mined to the building is visible above them on a ridge and shows several gondola cars used to convey ore (or whatever it was being mined).
- PhC\_207\_15 Spruce Pine, NC, c.1900-1910 A slightly elevated overall view of Spruce Pine, NC, looking northwest on Locust Street with a steam engine No. 101 with train at the depot, which is on one side of the tracks opposite a row of maybe four businesses on the other side, a crowd of people are visible on and around the tracks and piles of cord wood can be seen in the distance, advertisements for "Mighty Haag's Show" are plastered all over the side of one of the buildings. It appears that PhC\_207\_15 and PhC\_207\_16 were taken on the same day.
- PhC\_207\_16 Spruce Pine, NC, c.1900-1910 View of Spruce Pine, NC, looking southeast on Locust Street; logs are piled in foreground, crowds of people are visible as well as the train and the various businesses and stores and ads for Haag's Show, indicating PhC\_207\_15 and PhC\_207\_16 were taken on the same day.
