Col. J. H. Fagg, Comdg.), at "Camp Mangum."</p> <p>Discharge, issued on October 15, 1847, at Saltillo, Mexico, to Pvt. Robert Daniel (Edgecombe Co., NC), Company A, 1st Regiment, North Carolina Volunteers, for disability.</p> <p>Certificate of service, headed "Cabarrus County, October 12, 1848," confirming duty of the "Rocky River Troop of Cavalry," with the 62nd Regiment, North Carolina Militia (Col. Levi Klutts, Comdg.).</p> <p>1890-extra pay for Mexican War service of Quentin Busbee (dec'd), U.S. Navy, former purser, USS <i>Germantown</i>, to his widow Mrs. Quentin (Elizabeth B.) Busbee, Raleigh, Wake Co., NC, three documents (1889-1890).</p> <p><u>Folder #2:</u></p> <p>Muster roll (1848) of Company F, 1st North Carolina Regiment of Volunteers (Captain George Williamson, Comdg.). Unit organized in Yanceyville, January, 1847. Regimental commander, Col. Robert T. Paine.</p> <p><u>Folder #3:</u></p> <p>"Mexico" Lewis Outlaw Papers (one photograph of Outlaw as old man).</p> <p><u>Folder #4:</u></p> <p><i>Fayetteville Observer</i>, January 18, 1848 and September 11, 1849 [See Map Case, 2B, Military Collection (Oversized)].</p>
