

GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE, 1972

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The general correspondence file of the governor consists of letters, statements, reports, speeches, etc. The material has not been weeded except for the removal of duplicates. Empty file folders were retained with a notice to that effect placed in the folder. Duplicate printed material related to North Carolina has been transferred to the State Library. The filing system used by the Governor's Office is essentially the same as the one initiated in 1967.

In 1972 the structure of state government was changed following the passage of the Executive Organization Act of 1971 which grouped most state agencies into 19 principal departments. The 1972 files reflect most of the changes implemented by the reorganization of state government. Some agencies, however, retained their previous titles throughout 1972, and their records are filed under the old designation.
