Established by the General Assembly in 1961 (Session Laws, 1961, c. 361), the State Capital Planning Commission is composed of nine members appointed by the Governor. The establishing act provided for the following powers and duties: (1) To make a thorough investigation of present State laws, policies and practices with respect to the financing, location, planning and construction of buildings and other capital improvements for State governmental agencies in the city of Raleigh. (2) To analyze the building requirements of State governmental agencies in the city of Raleigh over such period as the Commission deems advisable, and to formulate and recommend to the Governor and the General Assembly a long-range capital improvement policy and program to aid the Governor and the General Assembly in meeting those requirements and a master plan for the future development of the physical plant of State government in the city of Raleigh over such period as the Commission deems advisable. (See G.S. 129.26-30.)

The establishing act further provided that the Commission would be dissolved not later than July 1, 1965.
