





To access North Carolina sources, scroll to the bottom of the DPLA home page, and click on "Partners."






From here you can search all North Carolina collections. In this example the search is for sources related to World War I.




To find a specific repository, scroll down the page to "Contributing Institution." Click on "More."




A list of repositories that have materials related to the topic is displayed, along with the number of sources on the topic contributed by each.




Choosing a specific repository will refine the search to that collection. In this example it is the New Hanover Public Library.
